

Energy information and where to find help:

The Warm Home Discount Scheme is a one-off £150 discount off your electricity bill.

If you're eligible, your electricity supplier will apply the discount to your bill. The money is not paid to you.

You can check via gov.uk **for the eligibility checker, and call the** from October 2024, Warm Home Discount helpline: 0800 030 9322

If you live in England and Wales you qualify if you either:

- 1. get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit
- 2. are on a low income and have high energy costs

Where to get help with your energy bills and free home advice:

The Local Authority (district council) **Household Support Fund** provides funding to help people who are struggling to afford food and utility bills (heating, cooking, lighting) and water (including drinking, washing, cooking, central heating, sewerage and sanitary purposes).

On your district council's website, <u>(search the internet to find your district, borough or city council)</u>, then search on the home page for Cost of Living, and you should see a **Household Support Fund** and other information to apply for.

The local authority, (district council) will have a page on **energy information and support schemes**, look on the website and type into the search bar Energy for details on where to gain information and support.
