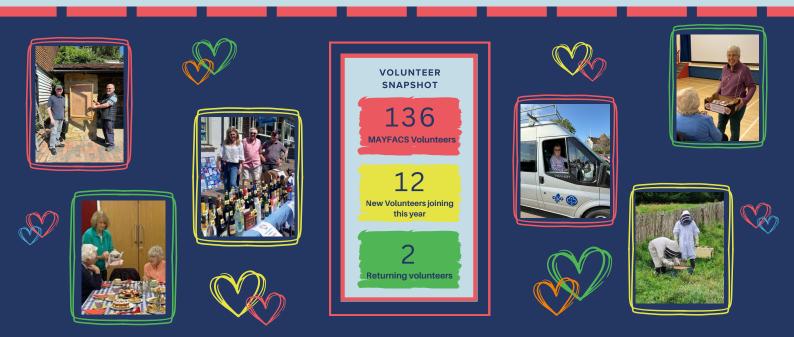


Volunteer Impact Report 2025

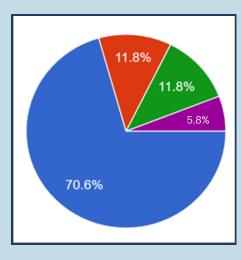
As an ad hoc volunteer, it suits my lifestyle whilst still giving the occasional opportunity to make a difference.

Our volunteers collectively give at least 2560 voluntary hours each year through an array of roles.



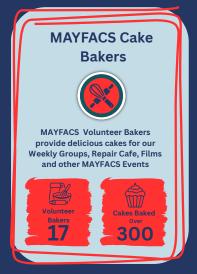
Value of Volunteer Hours £31,257

BSL training led by Mark Oulton. BSL is Mark's first language, he was born deaf and teaches signing to help foster a more inclusive community, making everyday interactions accessible for everyone. BSL is the language of the deaf community. It has its own vocabulary and grammar. It is a visual and gestural language which uses handshapes, facial expression and body language to express meaning.
